The Programs

The Colorado Jubilee Camp will offer three programs --- designed to meet the needs of a variety of participants from seasoned leaders to interested seekers. This year, the Camp will have a somewhat different structure than in previous years --- the Leaders Training and the Community Camp will be offered simultaneously, followed by the Silent Retreat. In addition, based on participant feedback, the Retreat has been extended to 3 ½ days. Morning meditations, body centered practices and opportunities to connect to nature are integrated throughout the programs. All programs begin with dinner the first day, followed by an evening activity, and end after lunch on the last day. Special discounts are offered for those attending two camps --- either the Leaders Training and the Retreat or the Community Camp and the Retreat.

LEADERS TRAINING with Pir Zia, Aziza Scott and senior teachers of the Sufi Order Sunday, June 20th – Wednesday, June 23rd

The Leaders Training will feature daily morning sessions with Pir Zia followed by your choice of afternoon "track" --- Retreat Guide Training with Aziza Scott or Esoteric Guide Training with senior teachers. New sessions this year include "The Sex Issue" --- a Panel on Boundaries, Psychological Issues and the Ethics of Guidance and "Best Practices in Growing Centers and Designing Classes". Each day before dinner, all participants will come together for an attunement and daily closure with Pir Zia. Evening programs will include zikr, dancing and opportunities to connect or just hang out. Appropriate for Retreat Guides, Sufi Order Representatives and Coordinators and those in training, and Leaders in any of the other activities.

COMMUNITY CAMP guided by Taj Inayat

Sunday, June 20th – Wednesday, June 23rd

Continuing in the tradition of our "Awakening" series, the Community Camp offers the opportunity to connect to the teachings of Hazrat Inayat Khan, Pir Vilayat and Pir Zia through teachings, practices, and experiential sessions focused on the activities of the Sufi Order --- the Healing Order, Ziraat, Universal Worship and Kinship. The camp will feature three morning sessions with Taj Inayat and afternoon sessions guided by activity leaders Zarifah Kadian and Munawir Mangold, Sharifa Norton and Muinuddin Smith, Devi Tide and others. Each day before dinner, we'll join participants of the Leaders Camp for an attunement and daily closure with Pir Zia. Special guest, Reb Zalman, is scheduled to join us on Tuesday morning. Evening programs will include "Getting to Know You!" party hosted by the Colorado Front Range Center, zikr, dancing and opportunities to connect or just hang out. Whether you're a long time community member or this is your first camp, you are enthusiastically invited to join us for the Community Camp.

SILENT RETREAT

with Pir Zia Inayat Khan and Aziza Scott
Wednesday, June 23rd – Sunday, June 27th

Go deeply into the practices of transformation on the Sufi path through the experience of silent retreat. Take the space and time to go within and experience the teachings and practices in the serene, beautiful and supportive environment of the Shambhala Mountain Center. Preparation for Retreat on Wednesday evening begins the sacred and joyful experience of turning within as a community. If you would like a personal retreat guide for the journey, we will be assigning them after the evening session. They will also be available throughout the retreat should you decide later. The silent retreat is open to all and first time participants are especially encouraged to attend.

Children's Camp

Shambhala (SMC) offers a children's program, Shotoku, for the children of program participants and staff ages 3 through 12. Children spend six hours a day in mixed-age groups with low student-teacher ratios. Based on a contemplative educational model, the curriculum focuses on the Shambhala teachings, contemplative arts, and outdoor activities. Parents are responsible for their children outside Shotoku hours. Teenagers ages 13 through 17 are required to either attend Shotoku (usually in an assistant capacity) or participate in the Mentorship Program. This program is an opportunity for teens to experience different aspects of SMC, including classes, the possibility of working in various SMC departments, and optional meditation instruction and practice time. It is important that all children attending Shotoku are registered. You may register your child when you reserve your housing. The cost is \$45 per day including three meals when staying in a parent's room. For more information, go to:

Making Your Plans

Plan to arrive at Shambhala no later than 8 p.m. either Sunday (for the Leader's Training and Community Camp) or Wednesday (for the Silent Retreat). Check in is NOT available after 8 p.m. You may check in anytime after 10:00 a.m. on either Sunday or Wednesday. Programs end after lunch on the last day of the program.

Transportation

The Shambhala Mountain Center is located in Colorado, two hours northwest of Denver and Boulder and two hours southwest of Cheyenne. Denver International Airport (airport code DEN) is the nearest major airport to the Center (a two-hour drive). In order to keep transportation costs as low as possible, the SOI Camp Team will be offering shuttles during designated times at the start and end of programs. To take advantage of these shuttles, please schedule your flight to arrive well before the last shuttle departure. Indicate on your Program Registration Form if you would like to make a shuttle reservation and a coordinator will contact you. Other transportation options include flying into Denver or Cheyenne and using the Shambhala shuttle service, renting a car, or sharing a ride.
